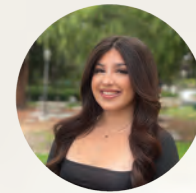

### Honors

#### The Johnson Scholars Program

This program offers full academic scholarships to up to ten of SCU's most academically accomplished, leadership-minded applicants. The program provides mentorships and financial support of internships, research, and studies abroad. The program is fueled by a generous gift from Rupert HD'14 and Maryellie HD'14 Johnson.

### First-Generation Students

#### LEAD Scholars Program

Kalmanovitz Charitable Foundation, Koret Foundation, and many others made significant commitments to support first-generation students participating in SCU's renowned LEAD Scholars Program. The number of students involved in LEAD has grown by 60% since the Campaign's start. LEAD serves about 10% of undergraduates, supporting students with their transition to SCU, ensuring they thrive on campus, and enhancing their success beyond college.

### Women-Powered

#### Catala Club Scholarships

Founded more than 94 years ago, the Catala Club, a beloved Santa Clara women's service organization, raised more than \$11.7 million for undergraduate student scholarships, bringing the total of Catala's scholarship endowments to more than \$32 million, generating more than \$1.2 million annually in support of Broncos.

### Community

#### Posse Foundation Partnership

In 2023, SCU announced a five-year partnership with The Posse Foundation, a nationwide college access and youth leadership development program, to offer scholarships to select students with diverse backgrounds from the Los Angeles area.

Scholarships for the inaugural cohort are made possible thanks to a gift from Bronco parents Jim and Heather Pigott.

### Jesuit

#### Cristo Rey Scholarships

More Cristo Rey Jesuit High School students will have the opportunity to fulfill their dreams of attending Santa Clara thanks to donations in excess of \$10 million designated to their success.

### Graduate Studies

#### Michelle U. Nguyen Endowed Scholarship

This newly established scholarship will support counseling psychology graduate students whose interests are in serving the mental health needs of the Vietnamese community. Michelle is an alumna of the School of Education and Counseling Psychology.

## Fueling interdisciplinary studies and enriching classroom learning.

Today's global challenges are too complex to tackle alone—they demand an approach that brings disciplines together. With your generous support, Santa Clara is realizing its ambition to transform education through expanded collaboration and research convergence.



### Community

Through a gift from Jacqueline Whitham '21 and the Whitham Family Foundation, the **Whitham Family Collaborative Research Awards** support cross-disciplinary collaborations involving two or more faculty members and their student researchers. Preference is given to projects that include at least one faculty member from the arts, and a portion of the fund is earmarked for student-led research.



### Research

**Fletcher Jones Foundation** provided funding to develop a new generation of interdisciplinary curricular, skill-development, and research resources that transform faculty and undergraduate engagement with advanced computing and visualization. SCU has witnessed a three-fold increase in its computational enrollments since 2012. Computational approaches inform breakthroughs in the sciences, business, social sciences, and humanities.

### Opportunity

Founded in 2021, the **BEACH program** (Bronco Entrepreneurs Advisory Clinic Hours), housed in the Leavey School of Business' **Ciocca Center**, offers business and law students opportunities to put classroom learning into practice by advising startups on legal and business-related issues.

## Sustainability & Student Success

Bronco parents Jeff and Tina Bird established the **Bird Innovation Zone** in the Sobrato Campus for Discovery & Innovation and the **Bird Solar Initiative**, which has more than doubled SCU's solar capacity.

Jeff and Tina also spearheaded impactful shifts in student experience, founding the **Math Learning Center** that prioritizes first-year math education and bolsters early achievement in STEM fundamentals, and other pioneering initiatives aimed at enriching the first-year Bronco experience.

*Students benefit from the campus-wide commitment to sustainability, with more than 1,300 classes incorporating the topic, and nearly 20 percent of faculty conducting sustainability-related research.*



### Silicon Valley Power Sustainable Futures Program

In 2022, SCU and Silicon Valley Power, the City of Santa Clara's municipal electric utility, launched a new Silicon Valley Power Sustainable Futures Program to develop a pipeline of diverse leaders in the sustainability and clean energy sector through scholarships and project-based learning.

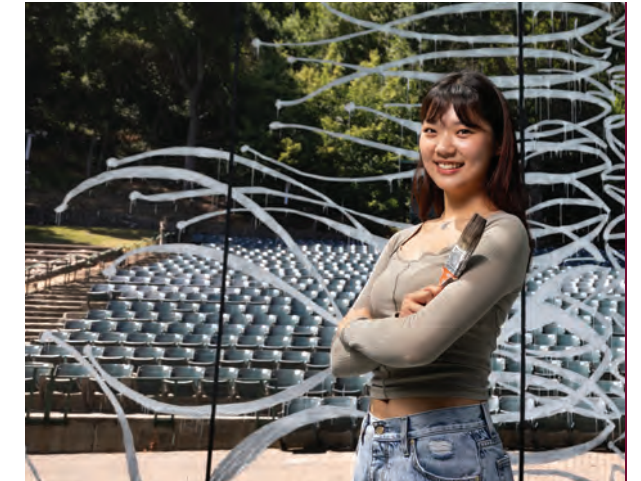

In 2017, the School of Law launched the **Tech Edge J.D.**, a significant innovation in law school education.

It combines legal, business, and technology education with hands-on skills development and individualized mentorship, while leveraging the school's location in the Silicon Valley and renowned tech law and intellectual property curriculum.

Originally established in 2015 by Laura Barton, parent of Christopher Barton '14, the **Barton Family Endowed Internship Program Fund** supports the College of Arts and Sciences' REAL Program, providing paid research and internship opportunities for undergraduates.

In 2024, the Barton Family extended their commitment to focus on providing important learning experiences, with a preference for Pell-eligible students and LEAD Scholars.

From Africa to Southeast Asia to San Jose, Miller Center works directly with social entrepreneurs as they strive to mitigate poverty and overcome challenges in the communities they serve through sustainable, market-based solutions.

Miller Center presents direct pathways for students to merge their classroom learning, professional ambitions, and personal values to effect real change alongside social entrepreneurs across the globe.

Housed in the Leavey School of Business, the **Ciocca Center** was established in 2019 with a deeply generous gift from the late **Art Ciocca** and his wife **Carlyse Franzia Ciocca '77**.

The University’s vision for the Ciocca Center—which was embraced and shared by the donors—is to create an environment to prepare students to be responsible and ethical entrepreneurs and business leaders, adaptive to the evolving workplaces of the future, and conversant in concepts like design thinking and value creation.

The Center provides opportunities for experiential learning, including its **Bronco Venture Accelerator**, a program that helps to move startups toward venture funding, allows student interns to gain leadership experience by ensuring the smooth operation of its programs, while offering an up-close opportunity to learn the startup process firsthand.

**Leaving a Lasting Legacy: My Own Business Institute (MOBI)**

The largest individual gift in the Leavey School of Business’ history was received from Peggy and Phil Holland. Their gift included a global online business training program and a significant gift designed to train emerging entrepreneurs. Today, **My Own Business Institute (MOBI)** has been fully integrated into the Leavey School of Business, motivating thousands of individuals globally to create their businesses. Following their passings, the Hollands’ legacy endowment was established to ensure MOBI would remain free for anyone, in perpetuity.

# Preparing students to create a more just, humane, and sustainable world.

Impactful investments are preserving our rich Ignatian heritage while helping us share it with the wider world.

## The Ignatian Center for Jesuit Education

Students have more opportunities than ever before to deepen their understanding of social justice issues and to experience the true meaning of a Jesuit education through community-engaged learning. More Broncos are participating in Arrupe Engagement, Immersion experiences, and the Thriving Neighbors program.

## Jesuit School of Theology

Thanks to your generous backing of scholarships and other critical initiatives, the Jesuit School of Theology (JST) stands ready to bolster SCU's global outreach. JST educates and forms community for lay and religious leaders from more than 40 countries around the world—many of whom return to their home countries and lead dioceses or religious orders. Notably, JST holds the distinction of being one of just two Jesuit theologates in the United States.



## Thriving Congregations

Parishes are increasingly intercultural and struggle to create cohesive communities across cultural groups. In 2023, SCU received a grant from the Lilly Endowment's Thriving Congregations Initiative to establish the Institute for Parish Renewal, to be based in the Markey Center for Leadership & Ministry in the Graduate Program in Pastoral Ministries, College of Arts and Sciences.

The Institute will help congregations foster deeper bonds among members and empower them to enhance the vitality of their local communities.

## Markkula Center for Applied Ethics

The Center has retained its focus on the rigorous analysis of real-world ethical problems and significantly amplified its voice in government, media, social sector, and technology ethics, fostering essential dialogue on critical issues like the ethical utilization of artificial intelligence.

### Collaboration

Thanks to support from the Lucas Brothers Foundation and others, the Institute for Technology, Ethics and Culture launched in 2023 as a collaboration with the Vatican's Dicastery for Culture and Education. The Institute convenes leaders from business, civil society, academia, government, and all faith and belief traditions to promote deeper thought on the impact of technologies on humanity.

### Venture Ethics

Another new enterprise at the Markkula Center is the Lucas Institute for Venture Ethics, which is the first and only institute focused solely on studying and promoting applied ethics in venture capital.

### Government Ethics

Through the new Government Ethics Fellowship, fellows work on projects at the intersection of new policy and ethics. This provides students with an academic research experience and an applied government experience that helps to develop one's ethical awareness and ethical decision-making abilities.

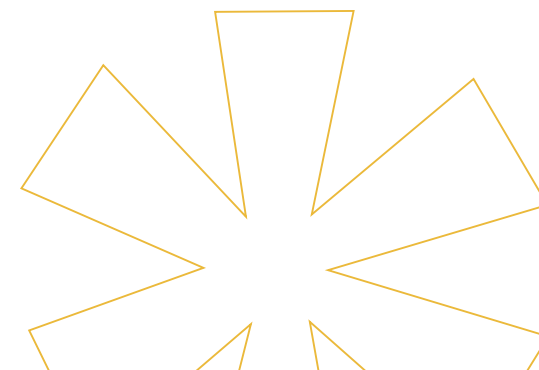

These are game changers for our athletics programs, made possible through the vision of Steve '60, H.D. '13 and Pat H.D. '13 Schott, Mary '84 and Mark Stevens, and many others.

### **Bronco Bench Foundation Scholarship**

Endowment increased from under \$30 million at the start of the Campaign to nearly \$50 million today.

Established in July 2015, the fund has grown to \$6.7 million.

### Inside the Sobrato Campus for Discovery and Innovation:

#### Bird Innovation Zone

Faculty, staff, and students of all majors are invited to use this Maker Lab to learn the basics of hand tools, power tools, 3D printers, laser cutters, and circuit board fabricators.

#### Josh and Chelsea Freeman Robotics Systems Lab

Led by Professor Chris Kitts, teams of students get involved in projects like developing advanced robotic systems and autonomous control technology missions for everything from aerial drones to land robots to underwater profilers that can collect and test water samples to find the source of pollution.

#### Healthcare Innovation and Design Program, Jack and Carolyn Lewis Frugal Innovation Hub, and Miller Center for Social Entrepreneurship

By bringing proven methods and key industry contacts to one location, we can maximize the impact of humanitarian projects.

#### Sordello Family Courtyard

A new academic, social, and public space for students, faculty, and the broader SCU community.

#### The Rob Lloyd and Karen Steadman Classroom

This 140-seat dual auditorium-style classroom is a dynamic educational space that integrates state-of-the-art technology to facilitate interactive learning and collaboration.

#### WAVE

The Wiegand Advanced Visualization Environment (WAVE) research facility serves as a hub for interdisciplinary projects that converge computational problems with the capacity for immersive visualization of complex data sets.

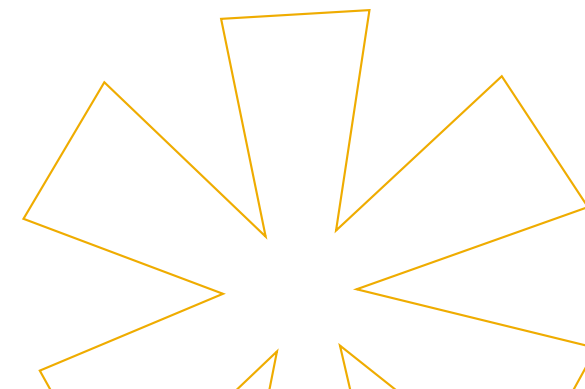
**The Imaginarium lab** is dedicated to exploring extended reality, data visualization, digital art, and game design.

## Driving innovation while attracting top talent.

Our graduate and undergraduate faculty are at the cutting edge of their disciplines and keep student learning at the forefront.



Sukhmander Singh has been teaching geology and geotechnical engineering for 36 years at SCU. Singh inspired one family so much that they created the **Sukhmander Singh Endowed Professorship in Civil, Environmental, and Sustainable Engineering** in his honor in 2022.



### Investment in Finance Faculty

Behavioral-finance pioneer and SCU professor Meir Statman and his wife Navah Statman MBA '84 made a generous gift to advance finance faculty excellence at the Leavey School of Business. The funds, which established **The Meir and Navah Statman Family Endowment for Finance Department Faculty Development and Research**, will be used for teaching and scholarship grants to faculty members and for expenses such as research databases.

### Child and Adolescent Mental Health

In 2021, Sheri Sobrato Brisson M.A. '94 and her husband Eric Brisson funded the largest endowed chair in Santa Clara's history.

The gift to the School of Education and Counseling Psychology established an **endowed chair in child and adolescent mental health** and provides funding to support research and public outreach activities related to child and adolescent mental health.

### Legal Access and Equality
